Poland announced in the late evening of 08 March 2020 that three earlier and three newer confirmed cases have brought the total number of infected persons to 11. The three latest patients were hospitalized in **Wrocław**, **Warsaw** and **Raciborz**. The Ministry of Health said that 168 persons have been hospitalized in connection with the current coronavirus outbreak, 932 are in quarantine at home, and 7,122 have been supervised by the Sanepid Sanitary Service. It has conducted a total of 1,154 tests, of which 11 were positive. The Government Crisis Management Team headed by Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki ordered the cancellation of all indoor mass events with over 1,000 people.

Latvia announced that 24 laboratory tests of potential patients in the past 24 hours were positive for four persons, bringing the total number of confirmed cases to 6. All 5 newer cases belonged to the same group of tourists who visited a resort in Cervinia, north Italy, near the border to Switzerland. A total of 244 tests were performed on potential Covid-19 patients.
