Among the six new confirmed infections in **Poland** is an employee of the European Border and Coast Guard Agency (Frontex). The Frontex headquarters in **Warsaw** located in Plac Europejski was closed on Monday, 09 March 2000, and its employees were asked to work remotely. President Andrzej Duda announced that the number of confirmed infections has risen to 17, following a meeting at the National Security Bureau. Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki announced on Monday, 09 March 2020, that sanitary controls will be introduced at major German and Czech border crossings into Poland as well as at ports and train stations to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Relevant warnings and notices are flashed on the screens of public transport vehicles like buses, trams, and trains.

No new cases were reported in the **Baltic countries** and in **Ukraine**. In Estonia, 156 people are being monitored by health officials, and nearly 900 children are kept in home quarantine. Ukraine is prepared for a large-scale outbreak, and is poised to ban mass events and temporarily suspend schools. Ukraine International Airlines, the country's flag carrier, suspended flights to China on 04 February 2020. Kyiv supermarkets do not report panic buying, and people on the streets hardly wear face masks. The Sunday parade for International Women's Day went ahead as scheduled.
