The Chief of General Staff of **Poland** General Jaroslaw Mika was tested positive for coronavirus, or COVID-19, the country's defense ministry announced on 10 March 2020, after he returned from an army gathering in Germany. Officials who traveled with Gen. Mika have been quarantined and are in good condition. Health Minister of Poland Lukasz Szumowski announced earlier that mass sport events and concerts were canceled due to concerns over coronavirus. The number of confirmed cases rose to 22 by the evening of 10 March 2020, the Health Ministry announced, the latest confirmed case being in the eastern province of Lubelskie. 200 persons have been hospitalized, 1,055 on quarantine and 9,366 under epidemiological supervision.

In **Estonia**, the Health Board announced that a third person had been diagnosed with COVID-19 coronavirus on 10 March 2020, bringing the total number of positive cases to 13. The patients arrived from northern Italy and France, and travelled via Geneva and Helsinki. All confirmed cases are stable and suffering mild forms of the disease. No local transmission has been detected so far.

In **Latvia**, two more were tested positive for COVID-19 coronavirus, bringing the total number of confirmed cases to 8, the Disease Prevention and Control Center (SPKC) reported on 10 March 2020. The first detected case, a lady, has recovered and will be discharged from the hospital.
