Poland announced a **state of epidemic emergency**, introducing border restrictions, suspending international flights to Poland, and ordering the closure of malls, restaurants and other places of social, sports and religious gathering effective 15 March 2020. A total of 119 persons have been confirmed infected, and two new deaths and 13 recoveries.

In **Estonia**, the government has declared an **emergency situation** until 01 May 2020 as the number of confirmed cases surged to 205. Non-resident foreign nationals cannot enter Estonia. Foreign nationals can transit through Estonia only if they do not show symptoms of Covid-19.

In **Latvia**, fourteen new cases have been confirmed, bringing the total to 30. **A travel ban** forbidding the entry of foreigners will come into force tomorrow, 16 March 2020.

Lithuania placed the whole country under **quarantine**, and **banned the entry of foreigners** from 16 to 30 March 2020.

Ukraine announced its **first death case** and declared a two-week **ban on entry of foreign nationals** from 15 March to 03 April 2020. Foreigners with permanent and temporary residence permits in Ukraine are exempted from this ban.
